

Learning Progress



What is it?

Learning Progress is a **learning analytics feature** that enables teachers to monitor the learning progress of each class group **across different assignments**. Mastery is based on marks awarded to the questions attempted by students.



1 Access Learning Progress


a Enter via a specific Class Group*

Subject Card > Learning Progress



b Monitor Overall Marks


Awarded marks from all attempted questions out of Total marks from all attempted questions by all students

3 Evaluate Learning Progress

You can use Learning Progress to evaluate student progress in a Topic/Sub-topic along two distinct dimensions:

1. **MASTERY:** Marks scored by student (Awarded Marks)
2. **PRACTICE:** Total marks of all questions attempted by students tagged to the Topic/Sub-topic (Total Marks)



If students demonstrate poor MASTERY, you can provide more guidance on the topic.

If PRACTICE in any area appears lacking, you can assign more questions or quizzes on the topic.
