## **Teacher's View of Class Group**

DO 🕢

Use Categories (by topic, importance or recency) to better organise resources

Use Resources to add optional materials for student self-study or sharing among teachers (in a teacheronly group)

Use Forum to create quick polls and conduct out-oflesson discussions

For manually-created Class Groups, link it with a subject and level to make use of Learning Progress

Use Subgroups to organise large Class Groups, e.g. a lecture Class Group with more than 100 students - they can divided in Subgroups to form tutorial classes

Add and remove observers as co-teachers (for mentoring, lesson observations) to existing Class Groups

## AVOID 🔀

Creating multiple Class Groups (e.g. for one-off observations) or more than one class group per subject per class as this can be confusing for students
